

Disposable Respirators

There are several different types of disposable respirators that we can accept:

- P95, P99, and P100 masks
- R95, R99, and R100 masks
- N95, N99, and N100 masks.

Approved masks will have the following text printed on them:

- Certification – for example, “NIOSH”
- Type of approval – for example, “N95”, “R95”, “P100”
- Manufacturer’s name and model number.

Elastomeric Half- or Full-Face Piece Respirators

An approved elastomeric respirator will have the following text printed on the mask:

- Certification - example: NIOSH
- Manufacturer name – example: 3M, North, etc.
- Model number

Powered Air-Purifying Respirator (and Accessories)

A PAPR is a battery-powered blower that provides positive airflow through a filter, cartridge, or canister to a hood or face piece. An approved respirator will have the following text printed on the blower unit:

- Certification - example: NIOSH
- Manufacturer name – example: 3M, North, etc.
- Model number

Accessories such as the charger, battery, filters, blower tube are also needed.

Protective Gowns

Gowns should be fluid-resistant and long-sleeved to cover the wrists.

Examination Gloves

Appropriate examination gloves will be labelled with specific words, such as:

- “Health care”
- “Examination”
- “Patient Examination”
- “Sterile”
- “Medical-grade”
- “Nitrile”

Vinyl, latex, or nitrile gloves will all provide adequate protection.
