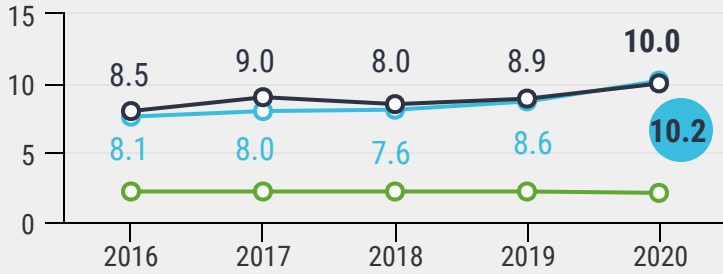

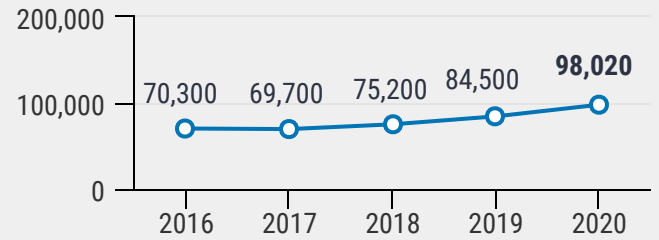

The injury rate for SafeCare BC's long-term care members rose to 10.2, the highest rate in over five years. This can largely be attributed to COVID-19, as there were almost 400 injuries related to exposure to toxic substances, while injuries related to overexertion and violence decreased.

98,020 workdays lost to injury in 2020, is like **losing the equivalent of 392 full-time staff.**

Total claims costs dropped by \$1.3M, or 6%, compared to the year previous. This is in part due to COVID-related claims requiring less medical attention and rehabilitation.

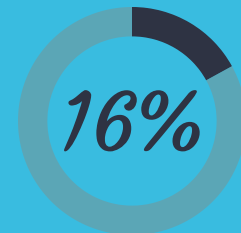
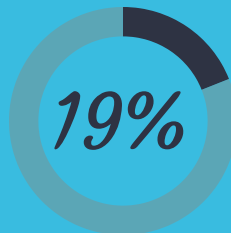
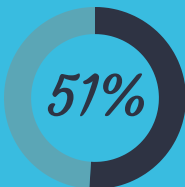
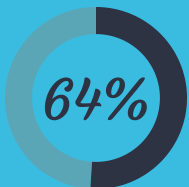


Did you Know?

Having an effective Return/Recover at Work program supports people in their recovery, decreases staffing shortages, and decreases claims costs.
